

Dear Parents and School Community,

As we commemorate another remarkable year, I am pleased to contribute to this yearbook themed "The World Wide Web" with our school's focus on "Using Technology Responsibly" - a vision that resonates deeply with our educational philosophy.

The educational programmes at HSI equips students for an increasingly complex digital world while upholding rigorous academic standards. Our approach balances technological tools with mindful limitations, fostering balanced individuals who navigate online spaces with ethical judgment.

This year, our IBDP students have received specialised training from our librarian on ethical technology use, with dedicated timetabled sessions on research methodologies and citation practices. While the IB permits AI tools for research, it maintains clear boundaries against their use for written assignments. In classrooms, our teachers demonstrate how AI can sometimes generate inaccurate information - fabricating poems or characters in literary analyses, giving wrong work in Mathematics - encouraging students to become reflective, critical thinkers and learn with understanding.

Equally important is our emphasis on responsible social media engagement. We guide students to develop strong selfidentity and emotional resilience, helping them understand that online comments need not define their self-worth or disturb their mental well-being. As principled digital citizens, our students learn to communicate authentically while maintaining healthy boundaries in virtual spaces. Expert sessions were also conducted in school to train students for the mindful use of social media.

Time management has emerged as another crucial skill in today's technology-rich environment. With entertainment options constantly demanding their attention with an Al-generated stream of content tailored to their interest across various platforms. We encourage students to remain focused on their IB journey and academic goals with help of strong mentoring. They learn to be inquirers who utilise technology purposefully rather than falling prey to endless distractions offered by their personal digital devices.

Our students practice being open-minded researchers who can write effective prompts for AI tools while properly citing these sources, demonstrating both technological competence and academic integrity. They are becoming knowledgeable, caring digital citizens who understand the real-world impacts of online actions.

As parents and community members, you are essential partners in reinforcing these values. Together, we nurture thinkers who use technology mindfully, recognising when to engage with digital tools and when to disconnect to preserve their mental health and value direct human connections with their peers, parents, teachers and community members through the CAS programme.

I remain confident that our risk-taking students will emerge not just as capable technology users, but as wise stewards of the digital world they inherit and continue to make a difference in this ever-changing world that we live in.








Maira Mahadevia's Resin Initiative

In July 2023, I organized Falak, an art initiative that provided a creative platform for individuals from the transgender community to express their identities, struggles, and hopes. Through a unique umbrellapainting event, Falak transformed everyday objects into symbols of resilience, visibility, and empowerment. The project fostered a sense of belonging and allowed participants to reclaim their narratives through art.

The event received significant media attention, highlighting the challenges faced by the transgender community while promoting inclusivity and acceptance. Witnessing the power of artistic expression in advocacy reinforced my belief that change begins with visibility and conversation. Falak was more than just an art project—it was a movement towards social justice through creativity.

Art Exhibition: Showcasing Transgender Artists

Building on the success of Falak, I conducted a three-day art workshop in October, training nine transgender artists to refine their artistic skills. The goal was to provide them with opportunities to display their work and gain recognition in a society that often marginalizes them. The workshop culminated in an exhibition where these artists presented their pieces to a broader audience, creating awareness and fostering dialogue about transgender representation in the arts. The main exhibition was displayed at the Cimroza Art Gallery for four days, alongside works by renowned artists. This platform provided immense exposure to the transgender artists, allowing their voices to be heard through their art. The exhibition was a resounding success, with five out of the nine artists selling their works. This milestone not only validated their talent but also created opportunities for sustainable livelihoods through art.

Through this initiative, I aimed to bridge the gap between artistic talent and visibility, ensuring that these artists could transform their passion into a sustainable livelihood. The exhibition was not just about showcasing art—it was about celebrating identity, resilience, and the transformative power of creativity in driving social change.































Sabri School - Adivasi Community

In the heart of the Adivasi community, the girls of Shabri School are redefining their future. Equipped with farming skill using modern farming methods designed by the Sonawala family, they cultivate strawberries, mangoes, and exotic vegetables, transforming their ancestral lands into a source of financial independence. These fresh, high-value crops make their way to Mumbai, where they are repackaged and sold, ensuring that all profits return to the girls for their education and empowerment.

Beyond just helping them sell their produce, our role extends to educating them with essential life skills, mentoring them, and engaging with them to build confidence and independence. Every interaction strengthens their ability to dream bigger and stand on their own feet.

Aarish and Arhaan have been actively involved in marketing and sales, contributing to their journey of self-sufficiency. Together, we are not just supporting their livelihoods, we are nurturing a generation of empowered young women.

































On the 23rd of March, I, Rana Madhani had the privilege of visiting Kamla Mehta Dadar School for the visually impaired girls. As we stepped into the campus, we were struck by the warmth and enthusiasm of the girls.

Despite the challenges they face, these girls exuded confidence and determination. We witnessed their remarkable adaptability and resilience as they navigated their surroundings with ease. Eating their meal and washing their plate post that! Making Till laddoos and paper bags and selling them for a living! We were spellbound. We had the opportunity to buy some paper bags and share with our friends and family.

The students eagerly shared their stories, talents, and aspirations with us. We were impressed by their passion for learning and their desire to make a meaningful impact in the world. The girls shared their routine with us. How they wake up at 4am and post their daily chores go for swimming and horse riding before their school time starts. And post their school hours how they study and wind up and sleep by 9pm. We were so overwhelmed and encouraged!

This visit was a poignant reminder of the importance of inclusivity, accessibility, and their empowerment. It was an honor to meet these incredible young girls and witness the power of education.

As we left the school, we felt inspired and humbled, with a renewed commitment to support more of such organizations that channelize the rights and dignity of such inspiring individuals.
