Kush Bhagat wins Gold in World Schools Championship in Russia

Every kid in town at the moment is anxiously expecting to receive a special gift from Santa Claus this 'Christmas'. However, Kush Bhagat, a seven-year-old chess prodigy from Mumbai, has already and in advance earned himself a 'Precious' present Christmas clinching the Gold medal in the boys' under-7 category of the International Blitz Chess competition during the World School Chess championship 2016, which concluded in Sochi, Russia earlier this month.

Kush, a Second Standard



student of Hillspring International School, Tardeo, showed great character and the confidence to come out trumps in the competition where around 190 kids from around the globe were in the

fray. He was the only Indian in the Under-7 category in the entire tournament. In the main event, he scored 6.0/9 to finish sixth.

Kush, started playing chess at the age of three and has shown a keen interest in the sport. Three years later he started winning a lot of city level championships, most commendable performance being the time he won the prestigious Under-7 Maharashtra state chess championship at Thane.

Like every young box Kush too is very playful and full of energy, but when he is seated in front of the 64-square board, he is completely a transformed lad, who is totally focused on the task ahead. That is one of his biggest assets, which helps him often to calculate his moves and plot the downfall of his opponents.

Workshops & Guest Speaker Talks

21 Oct - 16 Nov 2016

The students of Gr 8 completed 5 sessions of 'The History Project's Beyond the Classroom Course' conducted over a period of 5 weeks to enhance their understanding of history. Through various fun activities conducted by resource person, Ms Pooja Pradeep, the students understood concepts like the multiplicity of historical narratives, the impact of majority and minority perspectives, the difference between equality and equity in society. The concepts were imbibed using the example of the shared history between India and Pakistan and students examined events like the Revolt of 1857 and the Partition of Bengal in 1905 from the Indian as well as the Pakistani perspective. An enriching experience which enabled the students to become more empathetic and open-minded.



Students of Gr 6 interacted with Ms. Natasha Sharma (m/o Sidhant) who is the author of the series titled, 'History Mystery'. In the fun-filled session she shared with the students the importance of researching and resourcing history while writing a book. This helped students to make connections to the GP skills required to write their first Individual Research.



Mr. Utpal Sheth (f/o Aryaa) an experienced market analyst and an investor has been providing stock investment guidance through regular sessions with the students and teacher advisors participating in the Knowledge@Wharton High School Competition. KWHS is an online stock trading competition which students from the IBDP and IGCSE participate in teams with teacher advisors, Mr. Prashant, IBDP Coordinator, Ms Padma IB Econ/BM teacher and Ms Khushbu, IG Math teacher have to create independent portfolios and justify their strategies through various tools. Students acquire valuable life lessons and strategies on investments, financial ratios, competitor analysis through these sessions.

28 Nov 2016

Mr. Bussa (f/o Arjun) and Mr. Rathod (f/o Rivaan) guest speakers for a 'Fun with Science' session for Jnr Kg Alpha introduced the topic 'Friction' to the students. The different experiments included rubbing an inflated balloon against the children's hair and its reaction on salt, creating an electromagnet by connecting a nail to a battery cell with the means of a copper wire and proving that when white light passed through a prism, it split into the seven colours of the rainbow. The students were amazed to see how electromagnet attracted safety pins and understood how science works in everyday life.





9 Nov 2016

Mr. Birawat (f/o Param) and Mr. Shah (f/o Aaryamanvikram) conducted a 'Fun with Science' session for the students of Jnr Kg A. The experiment helped them to understand the difference between soluble and insoluble substances. Efferson tablets were added to create the 'Lava Lamp' which students took home as souvenirs.



Mr. Doshi (f/o Arham) & Mr. Gala (f/o Rohaan) introduced the concept of Gravity to the students of Snr Kg Alpha by conducting experiments on the scientific principle of Gravity. Students ate Freeze Dried Ice-cream to understand how astronauts ate freeze dried foods in space.



The third law of Newton-'Every action has an equal and opposite reaction' was explained by Mr. Gupta (f/o Arryan) and Mr. Jain (f/o Hrehansh) to the students of Snr Kg A through a fun experiment where students observed how the steam (action) helped the boat to move forward (reaction).



Mr. Ashish Bagla, an environmentalist conducted an interactive session with the learners of the Nursery class by using live specimens and picture flash cards to talk about food habits and food chain in the world of nature.





28 Nov 2016

Ms. Kapur (m/o Atashi) brought pet animals to class to create awareness on the responsibility and care to be provided to them. The students of Nursery interacted with mice, guinea pig, duck and Ms. Kapur's dog.

They made connections by identifying beliefs, traditions, customs and language used in the story to their ongoing unit on communities and cultures.

29 Nov 2016

Dr. Deep, the on-call vet at Pet Zone explained to the students of Nursery the medical treatment that animals require and receive. They visited the pool area, the X-ray department and the grooming room to better understand this.



In connection to their UOI 'Scientific Principles' students of Gr 5 watched 'Sphere of Science' at the Dome Theatre (Science Odyssey). This show was an inquiry into how human beings used their understanding of scientific principles and how scientific and technological advances impact the society. Students performed experiments related to physics and chemistry to enhance their learning.



The students of Snr Kg interacted with the horticulturists, Mr. and Ms. Shah (p/o Jesal - Gr 9) as they observed a greenhouse at Ratanshi Plant Nursery, Byculla. They understood how external conditions affect the growth of plants and learnt about a variety of indoor and outdoor plants through their inquiry.



2-6 Nov 2016

The students of Gr 7 travelled to Delhi and Agra to gain knowledge on the historical background of the Delhi Sultanate and Early Mughals and experience the culture as part of their GP syllabus. The trip was organized by the teachers with the help of INME and India City Walks.



16 Nov 2016

The Snr Kg students visited "The Garden Show" at The Cathedral and John Connon Infant School for their UOI on 'Plants'. They were entertained by a puppet show which introduced them to organic farming. Through different exhibits they gained knowledge on pollination, process of making cotton and honey, friends and foes of the garden and other uses of plants in our daily lives.

3 Nov 2016

Mr. & Ms. Sundesha (p/o Kimaira) personally took the Nursery students around the ARC stable to explain to them the art of grooming horses. They spoke on the classification of animals according to their food habits and showed them how to feed horses and care for them.
